Songs in the American Tradition

The music of the United States reflects our country's multi-ethnic population. The earliest music was created by Native Americans. Beginning in the 17th century, immigrants from the England, Ireland, Scotland, Spain, Germany, Italy and France began arriving, bringing with them new musical styles and instruments. African slaves brought musical traditions, and each subsequent wave of immigrants contributed to the melting pot. Many American cities and towns have vibrant music scenes which, in turn, support a number of regional musical styles as well.

American musical genres range from jazz, spirituals, blues, country, folk, ragtime, and barbershop to pop, rock, hip-hop, beat box, techno and American art songs.

Today's performance will include selections from the following repertoire:

### Traditional American and Folk Songs

**America** Music by Samuel Ward, Lyrics by Katherine Bates, arr. M. McDonald

Known as the "Dean of American Music" **Aaron Copeland** (1900–1990) was the first widely acclaimed composer to write opera, ballets and film scores with American themes. These are from Copeland's collection of *Old American Songs* that capture core 19<sup>th</sup> century styles, including *minstrel* tunes from shows with slapstick humor combined with song and dance, lullabies, and the spirited *revivalist* gathering songs sung during Christian conversion services.

In American's early days, rivers were the chief trade and passenger routes. This famous folk song is about a fur trader who fell in love with the daughter of a Native American chief, **Shenandoah**. This arrangement mimics the rolling rhythm of the Shenandoah River flowing through the lush Blue Ridge Mountains of Virginia.

Negro Spirituals are musical expressions of religious faith created in the African "call-response" style. These powerful songs are a unique combination of sound, movement, emotion, and communal interaction that focuses on faith and its role in overcoming daily hardships and struggles.

# **Broadway Musicals**

**State Fair** provides a glimpse into the life of an Iowa farming family with music by Richard Rodgers and Oscar Hammerstein, "the greatest musical theatre writing partnership of the 20th century."

Set in 1912, a **Music Man** cons the people of a rural town into ordering instruments and uniforms for a marching band by promising it will keep their youth occupied and out of trouble. His plans are foiled when he falls for the town's librarian. In "Pick a Little, Talk a Little" the ladies gossip, sounding like a brood of cackling hens. This collides with a four-part barbershop harmony about the lovely "Lida Rose." Packages with instruments and other surprises are delivered by the horse-drawn "Wells Fargo wagon" and "76 Trombones" lead the marching band they dreamed of.

**"One**, singular sensation" is a dancer entering the twilight of her career in this examination of the life-shaping events and decisions of performers from diverse backgrounds.

**West Side Story** is the American version of *Romeo and Juliet*. It examines the intense rivalry between street gangs of different ethnic backgrounds during the 1950s in New York City. The score by internationally-acclaimed US composer, conductor, author and pianist, **Leonard Bernstein** (1918-1990) includes "Tonight", "Maria", "America", "I Feel Pretty", One Hand, One Heart", and "Somewhere."

**Wicked** is the untold story of *The Wizard of Oz*. It follows green-skinned Elphaba from birth through the events that cause her to be misunderstood and labeled as "Wicked." # Contemporary American Music

**Randall Thompson** (1899-1984) composed *Frostiana* with lyrics from American poet Robert Frost (1874-1963). The "Star" so sternly addressed in this poem is *not* a heavenly body, but contemporary "star" in the world of poetry: T.S. Eliot.

**René Clausen** (1953-) uses dissonance in "tone clusters" to create enveloping harmonies as in this "catharsis" precipitated by the death of his unborn son.
